Over the past few decades, the labour market has switched focus from formal education to transversal skills and competences acquired through lifelong learning. This has also brought a focus on the importance of non-formal education and the skills and competences acquired through lifelong learning.

One positive aspect of this is that it provides a perfect opportunity for young people, especially young people with fewer opportunities that may not have had the privilege of higher education, to be competitive in the labour market, but developing skills and competences both at professional as well as at social and personal levels.

However, a lot of young people do not know how to register, assess and present those skills in a way that will benefit them. The online portfolio is an excellent tool that can help young people validate and distinguish their skills, accomplishments, and experiences by recording and providing evidence that shows their learning journey over time.

Furthermore, online portfolios can empower and reinforce the self-confidence of the user, creating sense of ownership and understanding of one's achievements.

## Objectives



- To explore the use of online portfolios as a tool for registering, validating and presenting skills and competences acquired through non-formal education and lifelong learning
- To explore the role new technologies can play in reinforcing the employability of young people
- To reflect on the use of the online portfolios as a tool for matching skills and competences developed through lifelong learning with the skills that the labour market is asking for
- To show to the participants ways of creating on-line portfolios, so that they will then be able to present them to the young people they are working with
- To help participants more effectively use technology, i.e. computers and multimedia as a tool to empower and strengthen the position of young people with fewer opportunities in the labour market
- To share knowledge about the ERASMUS+ programme and create a network for the development of common projects in the near future
